

ENHANCING SUPPORT FOR ROMA WOMEN VICTIMS OF GBV

PROJECT PROGRESS

Since our last newsletter, significant progress has been made. The project platform now hosts two training programmes developed by partner organisations: one for professionals working in the field of gender-based violence (GBV) and another for Roma mediators. In addition, partners have delivered awareness-raising campaigns aimed at increasing public understanding of the barriers faced by Roma women.

Partner organisations also attended the final transnational project meeting and conference in Bratislava, Slovakia, held on the 10 December to coincide with Human Rights Day.

TPM BRATISLAVA, SLOVAKIA

The transnational project meeting took place on 9 December and was attended by partners from Ireland, Greece, Spain, North Macedonia and Slovakia. During the meeting, partners reviewed all aspects of the project and discussed progress across each work package. A checklist of remaining tasks was completed, and the project platform and website were reviewed. The agenda also included final preparations for the conference taking place the following day.

FINAL CONFERENCE BRATISLAVA, SLOVAKIA

Stakeholders, members of Topcoach's network and project partners were invited to attend the final conference. During the event, all partners presented their organisations and outlined their contributions to the project. Topcoach delivered an overview of the project, highlighting the work completed and the key challenges identified.

The presentation focused on the significant obstacles faced by Roma women, including the lack of integrated support services and the broader lack of support for women experiencing gender-based violence. It also explored the historical context of GBV and the ongoing fight to address it.

"Women make up 51% of the population, do 66% of all work and produce 50% of food, yet receive only 11% of global income and own just 20% of land."

The presentation had a strong impact and was followed by informal discussions in which partners shared insights from their respective countries, reflecting on their experiences of delivering focus groups and training activities throughout the project.
